## Enhance your degree and employability

In a global study of employers, 62 per cent of respondents indicated that they seek or attribute value to an international study experience when recruiting (Molony, Sowter & Potts, 2011)

## Strong communication and adaptation skills

Another Australian survey found that "85 per cent of respondents indicated that learning abroad had a positive impact on developing skills to support their professional role." (International Education Association of Australia, 2016)

## Broaden your perspectives: *Culturally, academically, personally*

In a study by the International Education Association of Australia, 97 per cent of respondents found that learning abroad increased their self confidence

95 per cent also noted that learning abroad gave them the capacity to adapt and learn quickly as well as an improvement in communication skills

## Short courses with your academic college

- Developed by ANU academic staff specifically for ANU students
- 2 6 week programs
- Hosted in ANU winter and summer sessions or as part of a full semester program
- Specific areas of study and/or multidisciplinary approach with real world applications
- Funding available

## ANU College of Asia & the Pacific

### Learning Language Locally

In-country language courses allow you to complete intensive courses during the Summer and Winter holiday sessions. These courses combine the excitement of overseas experience with the benefit of rapid advancement in language proficiency.

#### Duration

 Four to six weeks. Study tour courses are held in Summer, Autumn, Winter or Spring sessions.

#### **Destinations**

- Japan, Indonesia, China, Korea Credit
- Six to twelve units.

### **Study Tours and Field Schools**

ANU courses are delivered intensively. Students undertake preparatory classes at ANU before being accompanied on the study tour by an ANU academic. Courses may incorporate language training, field work and visits to institutions.

#### Duration

• Four to six weeks. Study tour courses are held in Summer, Autumn, Winter or Spring sessions.

#### **Destinations**

 Study tour courses have run in destinations all across our region including Thailand, Myanmar, Indonesia, Japan, Samoa, Fiji, Hawai'i and Mongolia.

#### Credit

Six to twelve units.

#### LAWS4301/LAWS6301 Law and Development Clinic

- ANU College of Law students will have the opportunity to collaborate with students and supervising academic staff at a law school in a developing country.
- Topics are adopted in coordination with the academic staff of the partner law school, including, but not limited to, rule-of-law, justice, access to justice, professional ethics, human rights, gender rights, LGBTQI+ rights, indigenous rights, environmental law, and social justice.
- Applications via the ANU College of Law website are open through October.

### International Court of Justice (ICJ) Traineeship

- Nine-month traineeship with the International Court of Justice (ICJ) ICJ in The Hague, The Netherlands, assisting judges of the ICJ in their day-to-day work.
- Includes a \$40,000 travel grant to assist with the cost of living expenses.
- Program runs from September 2023 to June/July 2024 (9 months).
- Open to final year LLB (Hons), Juris Doctor and LLM students or recent graduates.
- Applications will open December.

## Unique first-year student learning abroad opportunity

- 2 6 week programs
- Credit-bearing
- Multidisciplinary
- Hosted in ANU summer and winter break periods at established ANU student exchange partner institutions
- Funding is available
- Curated programs options in:
  - South Korea
  - Japan
  - Singapore
  - Canada
  - Hungary
  - United Kingdom

## **ANU Partner University Programs**

- 2-6 week programs offered by our exchange partner universities
- Held in Summer and Winter sessions (during ANU semester breaks)
- Often includes cultural and social activities

#### ACICIS: Australian Consortium for 'In-Country' Study in Indonesia

- A non-profit consortium of universities that runs short courses, study tours and professional practicums in Indonesia
- Summer, Winter, Intensive and semester programs available
- Options for students from all academic colleges



## 2d. Independent Short-Term Options



To receive academic credit for an independent learning abroad program, course selections must be approved by a student's academic College.

## 3b. Vice-Chancellor Travel Grants



### PRIMO (First-year learning abroad)

#### Eligibility:

- First year undergraduate student who has not completed more than 48 units by time of departure;
- Domestic or international student
- Undertaking a Global Programs endorsed a PRIMO program at an ANU partner university.

#### AU\$1000 - AU\$3000 grants available

depending on program duration and location

\*VCTG indicative of previous years funding. No guarantee for future availability.



## 3b. Vice-Chancellor Travel Grants



#### First Nations Students

- Available to support learning abroad experiences for ANU students who identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander.
- Up to \$3,000 available for semester length programs
- Up to \$1,500 available for short course programs

## Access and Equity Bursary

- Available for short course, semester length and year length programs
- Up to \$7,000 available for semester length programs
- Up to \$3,000 available for short course programs
- Must complete a separate application with money allocated on a needs basis




