What are PRIMO Programs?

- PRIMO is unique to ANU;
- PRIMO are overseas, short, multi-disciplinary, credit-bearing programs for “first-year” students;
- Competitive funding for both international and domestic students;
- Not a first year student? You can still apply, but won’t be eligible for grants.

Winter at Yonsei (South Korea)

27 December 2019 to 19 January 2020

20 January 2020 to 5 February 2020

- Grants of AUD \$3,000 for first-year students
- Arts, Business, and Psychology courses available in the morning, Korean in the afternoon
- Beginner or Intermediate Korean available
- Take one or two terms of study
- KRW 1,700,000/3,300,000 (~AUD 2,000/4,000)
- Deadline to apply: 23 September 11.55pm



Winter at Yonsei (South Korea)

Cultural and Social Activities

- DMZ Tour – 28 Dec, 70,000 KRW
- Ski Tour – 4 Jan, 150,000 KRW
- Cooking Classes – 11 Jan, 60, 00 KRW
- Ski Tour – 1 Feb, 150,000 KRW





Budapest Winter Programme - ESSCA Business School

13 January 2020 to 24 January 2020

- Grants of AUD \$3,000 for first-year students
- Students study Business and Marketing in Central and Eastern Europe or East-West International Relations
- Fees:
 - Domestic EU 1,100 (AUD \$1,770)
 - International EU 1,800 (AUD \$2,900)
- Deadline to apply: 23 September, 11.55PM

- Deadline to apply: 23 September, 11.55pm



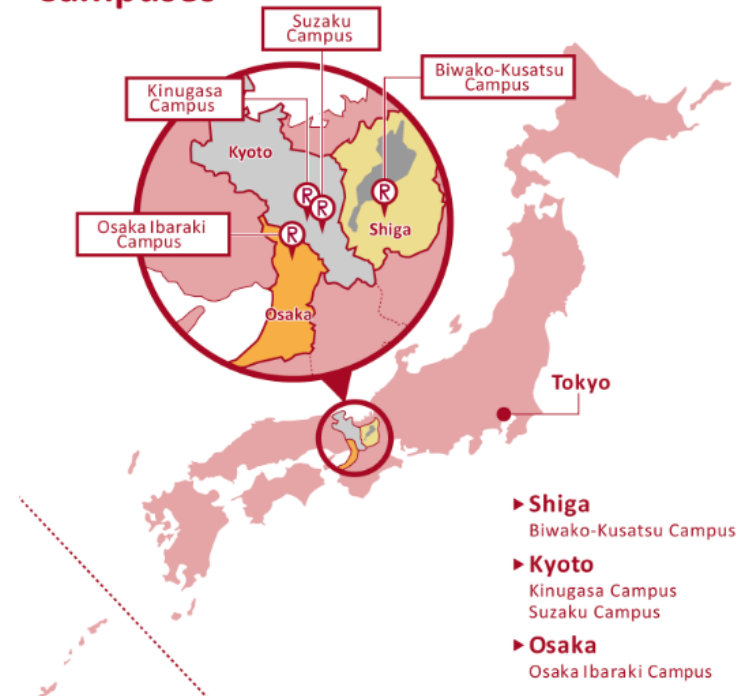

Grants and Funding

- All grants:
 - First year students – 48 units or less by the start of the course
 - Must earn credit
 - No negative service indicators
- New Colombo Plan (NCP) Grant
 - Must be an **Australian citizen**. Students cannot receive a Student Grant to undertake a Mobility Project in a Host Location in which they have dual citizenship or residency rights, or in which they have previously been a citizen or permanent resident.
 - Undergraduate – Bachelor's degrees only
 - Students must be aged 18 to 28, unless they are indigenous
 - Ritsumeikan in Japan

Grants and Funding

- VC Coursework Travel Grant
 - ANU grant
 - All domestic and international undergraduate students
 - All PRIMO programs

- OS-HELP Loan
 - Alternative option for later year domestic students
 - Government loan placed on your HECS Debt
 - Need 48 units completed by beginning of course
 - Students can lend up to \$7,998 for study in Asia, or \$6,665 for study outside of Asia

How to Apply for a PRIMO program

- Check you are eligible
- Check dates of the summer programs – are you available on those dates?
- Check you have room for credit - check with your respective College(s) and have them complete the Short Course College Approval Form
- Check you have sufficient funds to participate in the program
- Apply before the deadline to Global Programs – 23 September

- Make sure you complete each application:
 - Complete Questionnaire
 - Upload Short Course College Approval Form

- Select the PRIMO programs you wish to apply
- Log into the Global Programs system (GPS).
- You may apply for more than one PRIMO Program. If you are shortlisted, you are only offered one PRIMO program. This will be based on your best response to the criteria for the program.
- You will need to submit a separate application for each program, but you only need one college approval form – just attach the same one to the different applications.

While priority is given to applicants in their first year of study, later year students can also apply for certain programs but will not be eligible to receive grant funding. Later year students may have access to OS-HELP if they meet the eligibility criteria.

What happens next

- Apply by the Global Programs deadline of 23 September;
- Eligible students are shortlisted;
- Shortlisted students informed if successful for the grant (within 1 week of deadline);
- Students accept or decline in the Global Programs System;
- Students must then apply to host institution as well, before the Host deadline;
- Grant offers made and paid to students;
- Students attend pre-departure session;
- Students attend Cultural Awareness Training;
- Students receive travel Insurance and Participation Letter;
- Student pay the Host institution (tuition/accommodation) costs to participate;
- Students meet up and make arrangements to fly out with new friends.
