Step – Eligibility

• ELIGIBILITY - Please do check your eligibility for the university you are interested in.

• ROOM WITHIN DEGREE - To be eligible for a semester of exchange studies, students must have a minimum of 24 ANU units available within their ANU degree.



Eligibility check

At time of going on exchange:


- You must have completed 48 units (1 year of full-time study) before the exchange starts.
- You must have a minimum GPA of 4 on a 7 scale* it includes all courses taken in your undergraduate degree.
- You must have obtained approval from academic college(s) with signed College Endorsement Form (for 24 units required) for your exchange semester.

Yes to all? You can apply for exchange!

* The GPA requirements can vary from partner to partner. Some partners will require a higher GPA than the minimum 4 specified by ANU. Exchange spots are limited per partner. For restricted partners (ie. very popular partners frequently chosen by students), minimum GPA 6 to apply, at the time of application and going on exchange. Your GPA will be taken after your exams and that GPA (it's final) will decide your ranking for an exchange spot with an allocated exchange partner.



You can go on exchange anytime, starting in your second year onwards!





Step – Research and use Search


Two semesters before exchange:

- •RESEARCH Look through the <u>list of exchange partners</u> for suitable course offerings on the exchange university's website and their course catalogues.
- •DISCIPLINES OFFERED Ensure the universities you select actually offer courses in the disciplines that you are interested in studying in the correct timeframe.
- •USE PROGRAM SEARCH You can also use the Global Programs System Program Search to find exchange partners and narrow down your selections.





How to find exchange partners: Use Program Search






How to find exchange partners: Map search – move cursor over country





How to find exchange partners:

Advance Search – search by 'Faculties/Colleges' for disciplines offered, single vs multi-faculty universities etc



Multi faculty availability:

Options for student ie. not all partners can accommodate double-degree students or students wishing to take courses from several different faculties/colleges. For some universities, students can only select courses from ONE faculty (Single faculty only).


Double-degree students (or PPE), should NOT list any "single faculty only) partners as an option. The partner cannot offer exchange studies (time-tabling clashes, campuses at locations very far from each other). So please make sure only multi faculty universities are selected.

Single-degree students (or students only taking courses in one side of a double degree), can select either option if the partner offers courses in the discipline the student is after.



Search example results page

NOTE: the results list is <u>indicative</u> only. Students must do their own research and look at the partners own course catalogue to check what courses are available for that partner.

Step – Look at University Offering

- UNIVERSITY OFFERING Look at each university's exchange year level offered, GPA requirements, term dates, any language requirements*, full semester course load equivalencies etc.
- NARROW DOWN CHOICES Find at least 5 universities with course offerings that you are interested in, then seek academic college approval for your proposed exchange studies.
- * The majority of our exchange partners (@160) actually teach the courses in English.
- * The only exceptions are universities in South America, French-part of Canada, some German / French / Swiss universities. They may not have any courses taught in English or very limited course offerings taught in English. So make sure you look at the partner's course catalogue for what is taught.



Looking at a partner brochure page

Language: Most partners offer studies in English. Always check the partners' own website for what language their courses are taught in.

GPA requirement to apply for partner. The more popular partners have higher GPA requirements. All students still need to be ranked for the limited spots per partner.

Exchange year available to student ie. third year (96 units completed) and above. Most partners take students from 2nd year (48 units) onwards, with some stating later years.

Multi faculty available to student ie. not all partners can accommodate double-degree students, as students can only select courses from ONE faculty (Single faculty only)

Credit Equivalencies

ANU exchange students are recommended to take between 20 to 26 ECTS, which will be regarded as a full semester load equivalent to 24 ANU units. Students must discuss with thier ANU academic colleges for approval of their exchange credit.

Standard for domestic ETH students is 30 ECTS for half a year of studies. ETH do not recommend exchange students taking more than 30 ECTS per semester.

Faculties / Colleges:

Exchanges can be uni-wide or some are college specific. So NOT all partners offer the courses / disciplines you require and exchange may not be offered at some schools. Please look at what is available, as well as any restrictions the partner has listed on their websites.

Look at the partner's own course catalogue for what courses are offered. Make sure the partners you choose actually offer courses that you can take from their catalogue.

CREDIT EQUIVALENCIES

Each partner has its **own credit equivalency** for what is equivalent
to a full semester load at ANU. So
make sure you can find enough
courses to take with spare. Do not
be surprised, a full semester load
can equate to students needing to
take anything between 3 to 9
courses for one semester, in order
to earn 24 ANU units for their
exchange experience.



Look at partners' course catalogue for what you can study

- Students must look the partners' course catalogues for the courses/disciplines available for exchange (and any restrictions), as well as whether it is offered during the correct semester.
- Courses can be ones that complement your course of study or it could be courses that are not offered by ANU.
- All students must check the partner's website for the course outlines and seek approval from academic colleges for their approval that you can have credit for the courses.
- It may be helpful to take course outlines with you, when you see your college advisors for approval for your College Endorsement Form.

Only academic colleges can provide approval for your College Endorsement Form.



Credit equivalencies around the world

Examples of credit equivalencies for a full semester load around the world:

- Europe: 30 ECTS (could be 3 to 6 courses)
- UK: 30 ECTS or 60 credits (could be 3 to 6 courses)
- Japan: unit values vary greatly anything from 12 to 20 credits (could be 7 to 9 courses)
- USA: @12 or 15 credits (could be 4 to 6 courses)
- Canada: varies so much! Eg. earn 2.5 credits (taking 5 courses)



What is a full semester load at the partner?

- All full semester load and credit equivalencies can be found for each partner on the program brochure within the Global Program System.
- Do NOT be surprised the full semester course load varies at each partner.
- Students will take a certain number courses (it can be anything from 3 to 9 courses) at the exchange partner university, that is equivalent to a full load at the partner university.
- To earn 24 ANU units from ANU for your exchange, you will study the what is equivalent to a full semester load.
- Most students will take more than four courses per semester at the partner ie. it may be 5 or 6
 courses at the partner university that makes up a full semester load for many students. Students
 should work out how this works for them by looking at the partner's course catalogue.
- So make sure you know what the "equivalent" full semester load is at the host university.

ALL students must also be <u>enrolled at ANU</u> for a 24 ANU unit exchange code whilst you are away during the exchange semester.

Students will continue to pay/accrue their normal semester tuition fees (the cost of 24 units) to ANU and must enrol in an ANU exchange course code to pay/accrue their fees at ANU.

How credits are earned for exchange

- You need to pass all your courses at the oversea university (the full semester load equivalent) so that you stay on track with completing your ANU degree.
- After your exchange, ANU will receive your transcript from your exchange. Your academic college(s) will assess the marks and award "credit units" towards your degree. So to receive ANU 24 units in total, you must pass all the courses taken overseas. For your ANU transcript, the credits are annotated as "EE" which means "enrolled elsewhere" on your transcript.

Examples of how your ANU transcript is annotated after exchange:

Single degree (eg. 100% CASS endorsement, student with 4 courses/electives available)

ARTS 5920 24 units EE

Double degree (eg. 50% CASS and 50% LAW endorsement)

- ARTS 5920 12 units EE
- LAWS 5920 12 units EE

Double degree (eg. 25% CASS and 75% LAW endorsement)

- ARTS 5920 6 units EE
- LAWS 5920 18 units EE



MUST Seek academic college(s) approval



Step – Seek Academic College Approval




- •COLLEGE ENDORSEMENT FORM COMPLETED Print out a College Endorsement Form (CEF) and complete it by listing the 5 universities and the equivalent full semester load credit equivalency for each university.
- •ACADEMIC COLLEGE APPROVAL Book an appointment, email or drop-in to see your academic college(s) and get the College Endorsement Form (CEF) approved by an academic college advisor.



Fill out College Endorsement Form (CEF)

- Research partners, find suitable course offerings on partners' websites and course catalogues.
- Look at semester load equivalencies, GPA requirements, term dates, any language requirements etc.
- Decide on 5 exchange partners and list them on a College Endorsement Form (CEF), together with what a full semester load entails at each partner.
- Email, book an appointment or drop-in to see your academic college(s) and get the CEF approved by an academic college advisor.
- Students need to have a minimum of 24 ANU units available within their ANU degree(s) that their academic college is happy to approve for each application of a semester of exchange.





Obtain academic college approval

4 electives (total 24 units)

Much harder (not impossible) Be flexible! Do your homework.

- Make sure you do your homework! It's up to you to look at each partner's course catalogues /course outlines, from at least 5 universities to seek suitable courses.
- If you have electives (24 units worth of electives), then it is much easier for your academic college to approve your CEF. Your college will most likely not need to see any course outlines.
- If you have some electives and a major/minor you hope to use, you have to do your homework.
- If you do *not* have any electives, exchange may not be possible.

Room (electives) within your degree

- ALL students MUST SEEK approval from their academic college(s) advisers.
- A college endorsement form must be completed by the student and signed by their academic college(s) advisers.
- Utilise elective courses wherever possible, this allows for more flexibility!
- Double degree studies are not always possible at partners, so be flexible and ask both your ANU academic colleges how much room you actually have.
- Flexible Double Degree students must get both College signatures, if they intend to study courses to count towards both degrees on exchange.
- Double degree students make sure the partners you are preferencing in your exchange application are "Multi-Faculty" and NOT "Single faculty" only. "Single faculty" only universities DO NOT allow students to take courses from more than one faculty during their exchange.
- Also take note NOT all exchange partner universities allow students to take course at multi faculties, so make sure you are looking at partner offering multi-faculty college/faculty options in your program search.
- Students may run into the following problems during exchange:
 - Restricted courses
 - Cancellation of courses
 - Timetable conflicts
 - Course content not what it seems

If you are doing electives and an unforeseen problem arises, it will be easier to manage any changes to courses you are taking with your academic college(s) to approve again.



Double degree – multi college students

- Double (triple) degree students
- PPE students (this counts as 3 disciplines at partner universities)
- Students taking courses from more than one faculty / college / discipline

- Make sure the partners you are preferencing in your exchange application are "Multi-Faculty" and NOT "Single faculty" only.
- "Single faculty" only universities **DO NOT** allow students to take courses from more than one faculty during their exchange.
- NOT all exchange partner universities allow students to take course at multi-faculties, so make sure you are looking at partner offering multi-faculty college/faculty options in your program search.



No enough electives within your degree

- Please seek advice from your College(s) whether you have approval and any room in your degree for exchange studies.
- A college endorsement form must be completed by the student and signed by the academic college(s) advisers.
- Some students may be permitted to use non-electives (majors / minors) by their
 academic colleges. Students MUST go and see them to discuss your options. You
 MUST do your research (search partner's course catalogue), to see which
 universities have actual courses that may have sufficient course content, to be similar
 enough to a minor/major. If you do not have any electives to use for exchange, then
 exchange is not likely to be possible.
- It is always the academic colleges' decision as to whether you have any room in your degree for approved exchange studies.
- Exchange isn't always possible for every student, if your ANU degree does not have any room for studies outside of ANU.

Exchange is for one semester

Applying for ONE semester of exchange

- ALL exchange applications are for a <u>single semester</u> only.
- Students who wish to apply for **exchange (for one semester)**, you must have a minimum of **24 ANU units** available in your degree / approved by your academic college advisor(s), before you can apply for exchange.
- Exchange spots are limited. Please note the next set of ANU students are already placed to take up spots for the next semester when you are on exchange. It is NOT possible to extend or defer your exchange.
- Students apply again to go again for another semester, get a new college endorsement form approve and the applicant is ranked amongst all exchange applicants.

EXCEPTIONS

Applying for two semesters of exchange – YIA

• If you are a Year in Asia Student, your YIA application is for a one-year duration.

Applying for two semesters of exchange – only available with specific partners, please see Global Programs during semester two to discuss available partners

- If you are considering exchange (for one year), you must have a minimum of **48 ANU units** approved by your academic college advisor(s) for a one year exchange.
- Students can ONLY apply for a one year exchange for specific partners <u>listed as partners where a one year exchange</u> can be offered (the exchange starts in September and will end the following June).

Please note all exchanges are only for ONE semester otherwise.



(if applicable) Seek Language approval

Only relevant for student taking courses taught in: French, German, Italian, Portuguese and Spanish





Step – Language approval

- •LANGUAGE APPROVAL FORM (IF APPLICABLE) This form is only applicable if you are studying courses taught in a European language for your exchange ie. taking courses taught in French, German, Italian, Portuguese and Spanish. You must then complete a Language Approval Form (LAF) which must be signed by a language convenor. Applicants do NOT need to complete a LAF if your exchange courses are taught in English or if you are taking an Asian language.
- •SCAN COMPLETED FORMS INTO ONE DOCUMENT You will need to scan your CEF and (inf applicable) also your LAF, as one document (pdf) and upload the combined document into your exchange application in the Global Program System.
- •Your application for exchange is only for one semester of exchange studies. For YIA applicants, the exchange is for one year of exchange studies.
- •If you wish to go on exchange for two semesters (from Sept to following June), please refer to the exchange partner list, for <u>exchange partners where two semesters of exchange</u> are possible.



Studying in a foreign language

- Minimum language requirements for European languages like French, German, Italian, Portuguese and Spanish.
- Please see college advisors for the College Endorsement Form first.
- Then get a Language Approval Form and have it approved through the ANU School of Literature, Languages and Linguistics.

Please see the language convenors listed in the Language Approval Form for approval.



Your top university of choice will be your first preference, followed by four more universities of your choice.



- 2) RESEARCH COURSES You must research FIVE universities and look at their course catalogues on the partner websites. You MUST make sure all FIVE universities you are interested in, have courses available in the discipline(s) you require. It is up to you to do ensure you do your research.
- 3) ACADEMIC COLLEGE APPROVAL AND COLLEGE ENDORSEMENT FORM You MUST obtain as ademic college approval. You will need to see your College Advisor to seek their approval for exchange and complete the College Endorsement Form (CEF). You MUST upload a completed and signed CEF, this is in "Step 1" of your application.
- 4) LANGUAGEAPPROVAL FORM (only applicable if you are studying in a European language for your exchange ie. taking courses taught in French, German, Italian, Portuguese and Spanish). You MUST also upload a signed Language Approval Form (LAF) by a language convenor. Applicants do NOT need to complete a LAF if your exchange courses are taught in English or if you are taking an Asian language. Please scan both your CEF and LAF as one document (pdf) and upload the combined document in "Step 1" of your application.
- 5) EXCHANGE APPLICATION TO ANU You MUST list the FIVE universities (FIVE preferences) in your single application, by selecting each university from the dropdow n menu, this is in "Step 2" of your application. Your top university of choice will be your first preference, follow ed by four more universities of your choice.
- 6) TICKS IN ALL BOXES AND SUBMT Every task on your applic ation to ANU must have a tick against it before you submit your application for assessment by ANU Global Programs.
- 7) EXCHANGE PARTNER SPOTS AVAILABLE Exchange spots are limited per partner and some partners may not offer exchange if there is an imbalance. All exchange applic ants are GPA ranked amongst all the applicants w ho apply for exchange for the semester they have applied for. - 9) COMMIT TO EXCHANGE OR WITHDRAW After the results are released, applicants must either COMMIT or DECLINE the offer to go on exchange.
- 10) START APPLICATION TO EXCHANGE PARTINER Applicants who COMMIT to go on exchange MUST then start their exchange application directly to their allocated partner, as located in the Learning Content sections. Further instructions on how to apply to the allocated exchange partner will be provided at the Nomination Briefings, that all students must attend. Invitations will be emailed to applicants during results release date.



What do to with online application

- TICKS IN ALL BOXES AND SUBMIT -Every task on your application to ANU must have a tick against it before you submit your application for assessment by ANU Global Programs.
- UPLOAD CEF (plus LAF if applicable)
 Upload your approved College
 Endorsement Form and also (if relevant) your Language Approval
 Form into your online application (please upload it as one document).






Your date of birth is **ddmmyyyy** – just use numbers only, no gaps and no special characters.


If applicable, also have a Language Approval Form (LAF) completed*.

*LANGUAGE APPROVAL FORM (IF APPLICABLE) - This form is only applicable if you are studying courses taught in a European language for your exchange ie. taking courses taught in French, German, Italian, Portuguese and Spanish. You must then complete a Language Approval Form (LAF) which must be signed by a language convenor. Applicants do NOT need to complete a LAF if your exchange courses are taught in English or if you are taking an Asian language.


In your application to ANU, you will need to select the 5 partners you are interested in. The 5 partners you are the ones you have listed in your College Endorsement Form.

The first preference should be the same university as your top preference you started your application with.

MAKE SURE: Write down the five universities you're applying to, in order of preference. This will be the order you stick to, as that is the order that will used in considering your exchange application for the 5 universities. Once you have submitted your application, the order is final. No changes can be accepted after the application deadline.




Completed Application – shows green band





OS-HELP 2020

- OS-HELP amount in 2018 is \$6,665 non-Asia or \$7,998 for students studying in Asia.
- Submit your OS-HELP application <u>online</u>.
- Only available to Australian Citizens, Permanent Humanitarian Visa holders or New Zealand Special Category Visa holders.
- Commonwealth supported place in a degree program.
- Have passed 48 units (approx. 8 courses).
- Minimum 6 units left at ANU to complete after exchange.
- Note: students in their very last semester of degree studies may not be eligible, if you have no units left to complete.

Vice-Chancellor's Coursework Travel Grants

Access and Equity (up to AUD \$10,000)

- You must be an Australian domestic student and are financially disadvantaged
- This may include students that also meet one or more of the following criteria:
 - Identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander
 - Have a long-term medical condition or disability
 - A holder of refugee status/Australian humanitarian visa
 - From a regional and remote background
- Applications for the Access and Equity grant are online and open 25th March and close at the 5th May.

What happens next?



Applicants are GPA ranked

- APPLICANTS ARE GPA RANKED FOR SPOTS AVAILABLE Exchange spots are limited per partner and some partners may not offer exchange if there is an imbalance. All exchange applicants are GPA ranked amongst all the applicants who apply for exchange for the semester they have applied for. After the application deadline, the applicant's official ANU GPA will be used in ranking all the applicants for the exchange spots available and the exchange partner allocated accordingly to you.
- So make sure you have 5 preferences (in your SINGLE application) when you apply for exchange!

Exchange spots are limited per partner.

As an indication of exchange spots allocated from the last exchange round:

GPA between 6 and 7: @70% received their 1st preference. GPA between 5 and 5.9: @55% received their 1st preference. GPA between 4 and 4.99: @20% received their 1st preference.

On average, @3% of total eligible applicants did not receive a partner allocation from their five preferences listed. The students were still offered the opportunity to go on exchange. An alternative partner spot that was spare was then taken by the students, so that they were still able to go on exchange.

- e. Find 5 universities and complete a "College Endorsement Form" (CEF) and obtain approval from your academic college.

 Select your top university and complete the single application by uploading your CEF (and LAF if relevant).
- d. Continue to study well and get a great GPA! The higher the GPA, the more likely you will get your highest preference.

3. NOMINATION

- a. Await exchange partner allocation results. Mr mid-Aug
- Exchange is very competitive. The successful applicant is allocated one exchange partner from their listed preference.
- Log in to Global Programs
 System to accept (or decline)
 the nomination.
- d. Attend a Nomination Briefing.
- e. Applicant must then APPLY to the allocated host university with supporting documentation, with application instructions contained in the "Learning Content' for that partner.
- f. Organise course approvals with your ANU academic colleges.
- g. Wait for offer from the host university.

4. PRE-DEPARTURE

- a. Apply for accommodation, health insurance, visas etc.
- b. Apply for OS-Help (if eligible).
- c. Attend a Pre-Departure Session. Acct
- d. Complete an "Enrolment Change Form".
- e. Obtain final course approval from your academic college.
- f. Finalise all arrangements like flights, immunisations, currency etc.
- g. Register with Smartraveller

5. ON-EXCHANGE

- a. Go on exchange!
- Keep in touch and continue to check your ANU email.
- c. Check ISIS to make sure that your exchange enrolment is correct.
- d. Share your exchange experiences on social media (Facebook, Instagram) and tag




